Safe E-waste Disposal



When we dispose of gadgets and devices improperly, these hazardous materials have a high risk of polluting air, contaminating soil and water sources. When e-waste sits in a typical landfill, for example, water flows through the landfill and picks up trace elements from these dangerous minerals. Electronic waste from equipment of all sizes includes dangerous chemicals like lead, cadmium, beryllium, mercury and brominated flame retardants. When we dispose of gadgets and devices improperly, these hazardous materials have a high risk of polluting the air, contaminating soil, and leaching into water sources. When e-waste sits in a typical landfill, for example, water flows through the landfill and picks up trace elements from these dangerous minerals. Our school collects e-waste and hands it over for disposal in a safe and environmental-friendly manner. The first collection of e-waste started from 27th August 2018. How does a Vaccine work?

Vaccines - A vaccine is an inactivated form of bacteria or virus that is injected in to body to stimulate an actual infection. So the injected vaccine contains dead micro-organisms, which don't cause a person to become sick. White blood cells plays important role in vaccination. They fight with foreign invaders such as virus and bacteria. These invaders are known as antigens. We also have a group of defensive protein circulating in our blood that are known as antibodies. They float around in non-active form until triggered by an immune response, such as the detection of an antigen . When this happens, a billion of additional antibodies are produced that will fight off that particular antigen. This enormous army of antibodies now join in the attack with white blood cells and the germs don't stand a chance.

Strive For Progress, Not Perfection!

If you are feeling nervous about taking exams, you are not alone! When we can't cope up with revision or feel pressurised due to school and family, we are feeling stressed i.e. 'exam stressed.' We might worry about failing or not scoring well enough for the college admission. It seems scary to talk about this feeling. We feel that nobody would understand and thus, we do not share it with anyone. But sometimes, trying to deal with things on your own or bottling up can make things worse. When we feel anxious, we often give ourselves negative messages like: 'I can't do this', 'I'm useless' and 'I'm going to fail'. It can be difficult, but try to replace these with positive thoughts such as 'it's going to be okay', 'I can do this, I can try' etc. Try to imagine yourself turning up for an exam feeling confident and relaxed. It can sometimes feel like your whole future depends on what grades you get. There can be a lot of pressure to do well in exams which can cause a lot

of stress and anxiety. Remember, exams are important - but they're not the only way to a successful future. Talking to someone you trust like a friend, teacher or family member could help. They might not be aware of how their attitude towards your exams is putting pressure on you. Talking about how you're feeling can reduce the pressure and help you to feel more in control. If you are going through a rough time, it can be difficult to concentrate and find time to revise. Family arguments, death of a loved

one, taking care of ill family members, bullying etc. can affect your school work or studies. Talk to your teacher or counsellor.

Here are some tips to keep in mind:


- Don't compare yourself with others. Work on improving yourself. Set a goal on improving your marks compared to your last exam.
- Get organised. Work out a plan/timetable. Think when and where you are at your best. Choose the time and place to study accordingly.
- Break down your revision into small chunks. Don't set unrealistic goals. No one can study 10 topics in a day!
- Take breaks: Our attention lasts for only 30 to 40 minutes. After every 30 to 40 minutes study slot, take a 5-minute break.
- Eat well. Stick to home-cooked food and avoid junk food and energy drinks.
- Drink lots of water. Stay hydrated. It helps with our concentration.
- Try to sleep for minimum 7 hours and include activities during the day that help you relax (exercise, drawing, a hot bath etc.) during the day.
- Talk to friends and family. Seek guidance; not pressure. Set realistic expectations, it will help in relieving the pressure and also help in expressing any concerns. Remember, 'The expert in anything was once a beginner.'

All the best! You are capable of more than you know.
