## A PROUD MOMENT FOR SBPPS! REACCREDITED BY NABET

We are proud to inform that S.B. Patil Public School has been re-accredited by NABET (National Accreditation Board for Education and Training) after a deep and thorough inspection and assessment of our school by the auditors Dr. Sangeeta D. Gole and Dr. P H Bhawe.

Our school has achieved this milestone under the able guidance of Principal Dr. Bindu Saini, efforts of school coordinator Ms. Padmawati Banda, all sub coordinators and the entire team of teachers and staff. We are thankful to our school management and trustees for providing all the support to achieve this certification. The hard work done by the entire team of SBPPS has been recognised by NABET to ensure that we all continue to perform our duties to the best of our abilities for a successful and bright future of our students. Best wishes and congratulations to all!!

The Education Commission (1964-66) states that, 'The destiny of India is being shaped in her classrooms.' This clearly spells out that the success of the nation depends on the education of its people. Education has to be the core of national development agenda. School education is perhaps the most important element as it lays the foundation for further learning.

The Quality Council of India (QCI) is an autonomous body of the Government of India. National Accreditation Board for Education and Training (NABET) is a constituent board of Quality Council of India. In February, 2007, the need for accreditation of schools was stressed by the then President, Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam to ensure quality education across the nation. In line with his recommendation, QCI has developed the Standard for Quality School Governance. For ensuring relevance to the current developments in the education domain, the accreditation standard is revised regularly to bring about value addition to schools in their journey of continual improvement towards excellence.

NABET provides accreditation only to those schools that meet the Board's criteria for providing quality education as per the prescribed quality standards. Our school also shared the same vision of providing quality education to our students; therefore we applied for NABET accreditation in the year 2013 under the leadership of our former Principal, Mrs. Madhubala Gairola and Mrs. Shubhangi Kulkarni, our Pre-primary Coordinator and Accreditation Coordinator. Then, with the expert guidance of QCI consultants we started the process of complying the evidences needed for the accreditation. When we were thoroughly ready for our very first audit, the QCI auditors visited our school and conducted the audit. We were indeed very proud to have met the NABET standard requirements and were granted the Accreditation Certificate in the year 2014 for a term of four years.

Why do schools like us want to be accredited by NABET? What are its benefits to students, parents and staff?

- ▶ Holistic education for personality development of the students.
- ▶ Organized and transparent school system for better day to day experience.
- ▶ Feedback system to get issues addressed
- ▶ NABET accreditation ensures the compliance to the requirements of the accreditation standards
- ▶ Continually improves the effectiveness of the Education Management System.

### NABET Accreditation is also beneficial for the school staff as it:

- ▶ Establishes quality culture.
- ▶ Energizes and motivates staff.
- ▶ Implies a scientific and systematic approach towards teaching.
- ▶ Provides opportunities for continuous learning and training which leads to the professional development of staff in various skills.
- ▶ Develops an efficient and improvised working environment.
- ▶ Ensures job satisfaction.

As the end of four years' term was slowly approaching, our school applied for the renewal of accreditation in the month of November, 2018. By this time the standards for Quality School Governance had been revised by QCI. Therefore, the process for the preparation for the second audit as per the revised standards was in full swing. This whole process required an extensive compilation of evidences of various processes to satisfy the standard requirement developed by QCI. It was not an easy task, but due to the whole-hearted involvement and a lot of consistent and dedicated efforts of the entire staff of SBPPS we could complete the process successfully before the schedule time.

Finally, the team of NABET Auditors from QCI visited our school as per the schedule in the last week of June to conduct the audit according to the revised standards for Quality School Governance. And lo behold! Our sincere efforts paid off and our school was re-accredited by NABET ONCE AGAIN! This could only be achieved due to the timely guidance and support of our School Management, the joint efforts of the teaching and non-teaching staff and Accreditation Coordinator Ms. Sakina Bootwala. We convey our thanks and gratitude our parents who have entrusted their wards' future in our hands. I am indeed grateful to all of you for your support and cooperation.

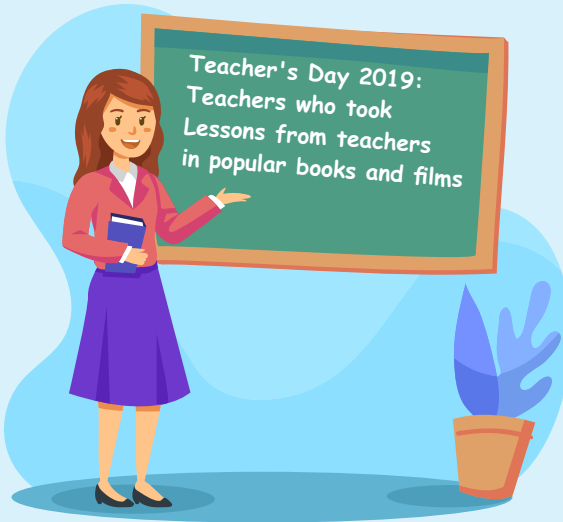

## CHANDRAYAAN 2: ISRO'S MISSION

We went inside the palace. Here are some facts about the Aga Khan Palace we learnt from this trip:

1. The Palace was built by Sultan Muhammad Shah Aga Khan III in 1892, and was donated by his successor Aga Khan IV to the local village during a famine emergency to provide shelter and food to the needy.
2. It has five halls and a large verandah to display Mahatma Gandhi's belongings and photos. He was kept on a house arrest during the Quit India Movement in this palace.
3. It served as a prison for Mahatma Gandhi and his secretary Mahadev Desai, and his wife Kasturba Gandhi. Both Mahadev Desai and Kasturba Gandhi died while they were imprisoned here.
4. The Ashes of Mahatma Gandhi, Kasturba Gandhi and Mahadev Desai are laid to rest in this palace. Thus it has a historical relevance to Indian freedom struggle.

The first room contained the nationalistic events led by Mahatma Gandhi - father of our nation. It depicted the chronograph of the affairs occurred in the epic history of India.

The room has photos of Mahatma Gandhi's supporters who selflessly gave their lives for the country on his principles of 'Satya' and 'Ahimsa'.

The fourth room was filled with the accessories used by Mahatma Gandhi and his wife Kasturba Gandhi. We found a room shared by both of them. Towels, flasks, glasses, beds, crockery; all of them were preserved with care. Then we approached the soul-enlightening segment of the tour. We saw the samadhies of Kasturba Gandhi, Mahadev Desai and Mahatma Gandhi. We were told that Kasturba Gandhi and Mahadev Desai died in this palace while they were in house arrest with Mahatma Gandhi, so their ashes were laid to rest here. After the death of Mahatma Gandhi, his ashes were also bought here and were placed near the other two Samadhies. Everyone looked at them with gratitude and a feeling of admiration. Everyone admired the scenic beauty of the palace. We came back but we could never forget the selfless sacrifices made by our freedom fighters. This trip was a reminder of all the challenges and struggles faced by our freedom fighters.

## HANDBALL

Sports and games are the only things most of the children like. I also like sports. Today I will tell you about the sport 'Handball'. The origin of handball can be traced back to medieval times but it was in 1906 that the rules of modern handball were first created in Denmark. This fast paced team game is hugely popular in Northern and Eastern Europe but is played around the world.

Handball is a very good and interesting sport. It is mostly played in European and American countries. It is also played in India, though not so popular. But then too I like it. The handball court has an area of 40m x 20m.

The fun of playing a handball match is to score more points than your opponent.

A handball game lasts for a duration 60 minutes. This is split into two periods of 30 minutes each with a 15 minute interval. For younger players, the period can be reduced to 20 minutes.



### Rules:-

- ☞ A match consists of two periods of 30 minutes each.
- ☞ Each team consists of 7 players; a goalkeeper and 6 outfield players.
- ☞ Outfield players can touch the ball with any part of their body that is above the knee.
- ☞ Once a player receives possession, they can pass, hold possession or shoot.
- ☞ If a player holds possession, they can dribble or take three steps for up to three seconds without dribbling.
- ☞ Only the goalkeeper is allowed to come into contact with the floor of the goal area.
- ☞ Goalkeepers are allowed out of the goal area but must not retain possession if they are outside the goal area.

The modern game of handball was first played towards the end of the 19th century in Scandinavia and Germany. Field handball was first recognised at the turn of the century and G. Wallström introduced the sport of "Handball" to Sweden in 1910.

The International Amateur Handball Federation (IAHF) was set up in 1928 on the occasion of the Olympic Games in Amsterdam, leading to the first Field Handball World Championships being played in Germany in 1938, following its appearance at the 1936 Berlin Games.
